New Projects

Fall is bringing with it the end of our renovations and the opening of our Haven Client Center (we're still working on the name). The space will allow clients, staying in our emergency temporary safe homes, to work with advocates, get educational materials, and attend support group.

As we reported in our last newsletter, Haven is working to create a few new programs. We've announced two new job postings, one for our mobile transport advocate and one for an additional transitional housing advocate. We're hoping to begin our mobile transportation advocacy program shortly after the position is filled this winter. The mobile transport advocate will provide a way for advocates to meet with victims in differing communities as well as assist clients in being transported to shelters and referred services. The transitional housing advocate will work with all our clients in our long-term transitional housing program.

HAVEN is a tribal advocacy program offering support for all victims of crime, specifically domestic violence, sexual assault, and human trafficking. We currently provide advocacy and services to all Eastern Shawnee and the employees, regardless of where they live, and non-tribal members within Haven's service area of Ottawa County Oklahoma, the cities of Vinita, Grove, Jay Oklahoma, and Seneca MO.

Emergency Services, legal and counseling referral, comprehensive advocacy, emergency temporary safe housing and long-term transitional housing for those that qualify. Our advocates assist with safety planning, referral to additional services, provide basic budget planning, support group, and comprehensive legal, sexual assault, transitional housing, and safe housing advocacy.

We also offer educational material on defining domestic violence, power and control, impacts of domestic violence on children, coping skills and codependency, and the importance of self-care for both men and women.
